Jubilee Pool opening

On Monday 18 July, Jubilee Pool in Penzance was officially reopened by His Royal Highness, The Prince of Wales. The reopening formed part of a visit by Their Royal Highnesses The Prince of Wales and The Duchess of Cornwall to Penzance on the first day of their annual visit to Cornwall – making this a real red letter day for the town.



His Royal Highness visited Jubilee Pool, which has been an iconic feature on the Penzance seafront for many years. Following storm damage in February 2014, the pool has been closed for the past two summer seasons. However, after an extensive repair project, the pool was reopened in May this year. Since the successful reopening of the pool a range of activities have been hosted; stand-up paddle boarding, water polo and yoga classes to name but a few.

Twenty children from Newlyn School (5 from each KS2 Year Group) were invited to this special occasion. During the visit, His Royal Highness toured the pool and met representatives from the Jubilee Pool renovation project, including Cornwall Council, CORMAC and Tempus officers, as well as users of the pool including The Friends of Jubilee Pool, Penzance Swimming Association and Water Polo Club, Penzance Bathing Belles and the Nippers Group from the St Ives Surf Life Saving Club.

Outstanding Payments

A text message will be coming out to all those with outstanding debt/monies owed to the school. Please can you all check if the text is correct and clear the account over this weekend. This is important - our Academy Trust financial closedown procedure requires all monies to be cleared and processed by the end of the summer term.

Head Lice

Head Lice or nits these make your children feel lousy (hence the name head louse) and there have been reports of them in various classes. It is recommended practice to use a metal head lice comb with normal conditioner through children's hair every week, and to check your child's hair every other day - it's the only way to eradicate them.
