Newlyn School took part in Penzance's St Piran's parade on Friday. The dancers from Class 4 and the band made everyone connected to the school very




proud. It was mentioned by persons in the audience how smart

## Governor Vacancy

We are looking for people who want to make a positive contribution to children's education here at Newlyn School to become School Governors. We currently have a Parent Governor Vacancy and a Community Governor Vacancy.

### What do school governors do?

The governing body of a school is responsible for ensuring that it is run to promote pupil achievement. Its duties include:

- setting strategic direction, policies and objectives
- approving the school budget
- reviewing progress against the school's budget and objectives
- appointing, challenging and supporting the headteacher

The governing body is made up of:

- parent governors (elected by parents)
- staff representatives (elected by school staff)
- local authority governors (appointed by the local authority)
- community governors (members of the local community appointed by the governing body)

#### What would be involved?

Governing bodies make their decisions based on the advice of committees that deal with specific issues, such as the school's curriculum, premises or finances. If you become a governor, you will probably be asked to serve on a committee where you have an interest and can make a contribution. In a typical month you can expect to spend at least four to six hours on your duties.

Being a governor is a serious commitment, but it can be rewarding.
